

Post Office Directory Extract 1859 Upton Lovell



Upton Lovell is a township, parish, and small village on the banks of the Wiley, in Heytesbury Hundred, Warminster Union, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and deanery of Wylye, South Wilts, distant 5 ½ miles south-east from Warminster station, 120 from London, and 1 ½ south-east-by-south from Heytesbury. The living is a rectory, value £325, with residence, in the patronage of the Lord Chancellor; the Rev. William Gray is the incumbent.

Here is a small Free School. Joseph Everett, Esq., is lord of the manor. There is a large manufactory here, employing about 200 persons, which does a considerable trade in superfine woollen cloths.

Population, 1851, 233; area in acres, 1,387; rateable value, £923.

POST OFFICE – James Dyer, receiver. Letters arrive by foot messenger from Heytesbury at 8.20 a.m.; dispatched at 5.25 p.m. The nearest money order office is at Heytesbury.
