

## Poor Law and Union Workhouse Business

We, the Guardians of the Bradford Union, in the counties of Wilts and Somerset, assembled at a Board, held this 18th Day of October 1836, do hereby give Notice, that the said Union has, in pursuance of the Provisions of the Act of the 6th and 7th of Wm. IV. cap. 86, entitled "An Act for Registering Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England" been divided by the Guardians, with the approval of the Registrar General, into the following Registrar's Districts, namely:-

The Bradford South Eastern District comprising the Parishes of Wingfield, with Rowley, Westwood with Iford, Freshford, Broughton Gifford, Great Chalfield, Little Chalfield with Cottles. The Tythings of Trowle, Limpley Stoke, Atworth, Holt and Leigh, and Woolley, all in the Parish of Bradford. The parts of the Borough of Bradford Iying South of the River. The parts of the Borough of Bradford situated on the South Eastern side of the road leading from the centre of the Bridge through the Market Place, up Silver Street and Woolley Street to the House now occupied by Farmer Newberry, in Holt Road and that part of Woolley Street in the Borough of Bradford, commencing with the House now occupied by Mr. Samuel Hart, and extending Eastward therefrom.

The Bradford North Western District comprising the parts of the Borough of Bradford not comprised in the South Eastern District, the Tythings of Winsley, and Wraxall in the parish of Bradford and the parish of Monkton Farleigh
