WINTERBOURNE EARLS (or WINTERBOURNE) is a village and parish, in the Bourne valley, 2 miles south-west from Porton station on the main line of the London and South Western railway, 3½ north-east from Salisbury and 6 south-east from Amesbury, in the Southern division of the county, Alderbury hundred, Salisbury and Amesbury petty sessional division, Salisbury County Court district, Amesbury Union, rural deanery of Amesbury (Alderbury portion), archdeaconry of Sarum and diocese of Salisbury.

The church of St Michael, erected in 1868, near the former site, for this parish and that of Winterbourne Dauntsey, is a fine building of flint and stone in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave of three bays, south porch, south aisle and an embattled tower with pinnacles, containing 5 bells and a clock, the gift of Richard Blake, Esq. The east window and others in the chancel are stained; a new organ was provided in 1913; there are 287 sittings. The register for this parish dates from 1557, that of Winterbourne Dauntsey from 1561.

The living is a vicarage, with Winterbourne Dauntsey annexed, joint net yearly value £315, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held since 1897 by the Rev Frank Elcho Skyrme M.A. of Brasenose College, Oxford, and rural dean of Amesbury (Alderbury portion).

The poor of this parish participate in Tanner's charity (see Winterbourne Gunner) and also in Cartwright's charity. The hamlet of Hurdcott, half a mile south, consists of a large number of cottages.

There is a small Wesleyan Chapel.

Capt George Hounsom Fort, who is lord of the manor, and Mrs Wyndham-Long, who is lady of the manor of Hurdcott, are also chief landowners.

The soil is chalk; subsoil same. The chief crops are wheat, barley and roots. The area is 1,703 acres; rateable value $\mathfrak{L}1,790$. The population in 1911 was 227.
