Letter from the Vicarage

November is the month for remembering. It begins with All Saints Day, when the church celebrates unsung Christians who have inspired us down the ages. But for most people it is, of course, Remembrance Sunday which focuses our remembering. This year our thoughts turn particularly to those who fought, and the many that died, in the First World War.

The statistics are staggering. A total of about 17 million people died in WW1, around 700,000 of them British service men. The conditions were appalling, and attempts to portray the scale and horror leave us stunned.

It is only as the numbers become human beings that the true impact sinks in. We have recently been clearing my mother's flat and there we came upon some WW1 memorabilia. A 'death penny' was sent to the family of each service man killed in WW1, and we found one in memory of one of my great uncles, who was in the Wiltshire regiment. I had never heard of him before. We also discovered the medals won by my grandfather who was in the Royal Flying Corps. He died when I was four, and I knew nothing about his military service. As I handled these items, which until last month I did not know existed, the past became more real, and history became personal. And I suppose that is what has to happen for any of us before we can take in the significance of great events. 17 million killed in WW1 is a statistic which I cannot absorb But to think that each of those was a

person dear to others, love destroyed 17 million times over, that is a human tragedy of the greatest proportions.

At this time of year the idea of sacrifice becomes very important to us. My great uncle, Reg Yeatman, gave his life in the service of others.

Perhaps this gives us an insight into the central symbol of the Christian faith - the cross. The cross you will find everywhere, in Christian churches and beyond. Maybe you wear one around your neck? It is THE Christian symbol because Jesus gave his life on a cross as a sacrifice for us all. Potentially, that sacrifice is for everyone, and through the cross anyone can receive forgiveness of their sins, and be reconciled to God who loves them. But like WW1 statistics, that sacrifice means nothing until it becomes personal. Jesus invites us all to have faith in what he has done for us, give up the hope that we can save ourselves, and trust in what he has done for us. The Christian faith is personal, it is about us following and trusting in Jesus. When we begin to trust him his sacrifice becomes real. No longer is it just a moment in history, Jesus becomes our friend, the centre of everything, the one who is with us forever. Becoming personal, that's the key.

1. A new supplier of electricity has been chosen, with a reduced tariff, and a contract entered into with effect from 1^{st} October.



VILLAGE HALL MAINTENANCE DAYS IN NOVEMBER


We are trying to complete the inner foyer before the Christmas Bazaar at the end of November and so plan a number of maintenance days in November as follows:

COME AND JOIN THE TEAM AT STONEHENGE AND HELP BRING HISTORY TO LIFE.

Five recreated Neolithic Houses, based on a nearby Neolithic site Durrington Walls, have been built by a team of dedicated volunteers over the last four months. The houses opened to the public in early June and there are still ways for you to get involved.

English Heritage are looking for volunteers to spend time in the Neolithic Houses, to talk to visitors about the way people lived, using replica items such as pots, baskets, clothing and furniture to help bring the past to life. What's happening on the farm!

The maize was cut on the 22nd September, yielding a very healthy 18.5 tonnes per acre. As part of the agronomy package that came with growing the maize, we had to fill a sample bag with freshly cut maize and send it off to be analysed. One of the main characteristics we look for in the analysis is starch content (energy). This year it was 458 grams of starch per kilogram. This reading is very high on the scale; the cattle should grow well this winter!!

Whilst waiting for this wet spell to end I have had a chance to catch up with the outstanding paperwork. I have recently spent a few hours familiarising myself with some changes to, and new rules of, the Farm Assurance scheme to which we belong. Red Tractor Assurance enjoy changing things on a regular basis, just to add a little bit more paperwork our end! However if we want the certificate then we must comply because when we come to sell any of our cattle there is a premium for being Farm Assured.

We have recently wormed our entire yearling and bulling heifer groups; they are wormed at turn out, however it gives them only 4 months protection against worms. Once the 4 months has ended we like to worm them again before we bring them in for winter housing. We use a wormer that protects them against gut worm, lung worm and liver fluke. It is most important that the cattle are protected because worms can have devastating effects on their health.

Finally please can all dog walkers please pick up their dog's mess! I was milking at my Grandfather's farm recently, when a heifer aborted her calf. A blood test was carried out and the cause of the abortion was Neospora! There is no cure for this at the moment and unfortunately this animal will have to be put down. This is a serious problem throughout the UK, so please pick up your dog mess.



Our speaker for October was Barbara Fuller, who gave a talk on Victorian Health: Dirt, Death, Stink & Disease. She gave us an interesting insight into Victorian health practices, and living conditions. It was pretty gruesome. Many so-called cures did more harm than good. Thank goodness for the NHS today.



Whilst the lunch clubs are certainly up there, the part of this job that I love the most is getting to listen to people's stories. Something that always strikes me is the incredible amount of knowledge, skill and passion that everyone I chat with has, whether they themselves realise it or not. I

learn more about our community and the people living in it every day through the conversations I have and the stories I hear. Often, the best conversations are with the people I have never met before. I have learnt about informal groups, good walks, personal journeys, local village history and even a story about a pet monkey in Potterne!

I often wonder how many stories are out there that nobody hears and as Christmas approaches and the weather takes a turn for the worst, I am sure we all become ever more conscious that there are those out there that may not have family and friends around them to share those stories with. Locally, there are a number of social groups and events that cater for a wide range of interests all year round and I am always happy to help people get involved where I can, be it through linking people up with transport options, group organisers or other interested individuals.

The internet is a fantastic resource for finding out what is going on in the area but often the people I chat with either do not have a computer or if they do are unable to use it.
