

Letter from the Vicarage

'I haven't done anything wrong'.

How often have we heard that over the past few years? It came to mind as I was reading an article about a top banker. He said that, in the continuing fallout from the banking collapse, bankers are becoming too regulated, and therefore not willing to take enough risks. 'We've done nothing wrong' seemed to be a constant cry after the 2008 banking crisis.

It was the call of many MPs over the expenses scandal; 'we have kept within the law, so don't blame us'.

The thing is; keeping within the law isn't the only thing that matters.

I remember studying ethics at college. Fundamental to the subject is the difference between right and wrong on one hand, and good and bad on the other. They are not the same thing.

Let me give you an example. A doctor sees someone collapse in the street and he parks on double yellow lines to help. He saves the person's life, but is taken to court for breaking the parking law. He has done wrong in parking where he has, but he has done good in saving a life. So in court he must plead guilty, but with extenuating circumstances.

That doctor did wrong, yet still did something good, it is also possible to keep within the law (do right) and actually do bad. Perhaps that's what some people in public life fail to see.

Jesus had just the same problem with a group called the Pharisees. They were

fanatical about keeping the law. Jesus healed on the Sabbath and so broke the interpretation they put on one of their laws. 'Do your healing some other day', they said. Jesus pointed out to them that by keeping so close to their law they were in fact doing bad; the needs of a sick person are more important than details of law.

In a church where I served there was once a person who was a stickler for detail, and who pulled me up over all sorts of things I didn't get quite right. None of them were important, but it was annoying, and the worst thing was, he never did anything wrong himself. But the way he did things, although they were always right, offended everyone. There was a smugness about his attitude which was deeply unpleasant. He was always right, but not good.

If any of us could choose what went on our gravestone, I think we would much prefer the words to be: 'he was good' rather than 'he was always right'.

Jesus was at pains to tell us that God's laws are there for the good of human beings, and the needs of people come before the detail. 'Love God with all you have, and love your neighbour as yourself'. Those are the two main laws, Jesus said. Measure everything by those and you will do GOOD as well as doing RIGHT.

Falling and fear of it is a common issue that I come up against when chatting with people out and about in the community. According to a recent Age UK report every minute 6 people over the age of 65 will suffer a fall nationwide and an RVS report found that over half of those that fall don't tell their doctor because they believe the fall to be too minor.

It is important not to ignore these falls and there are active steps that can be taken to rebuild confidence and decrease the chances of further falls by improving balance and stability. A good starting point is to tell your GP as there may be other contributing factors such as vision problems, arthritis or issues with medication that they can help you with to minimise the risk.

One of the things that I recommend for anyone that has recently fallen (or is worried about falling) is to get themselves a personal alarm. These can be worn around the wrist or on a necklace and have a wireless connection to your telephone. If you fall you can press the button on the alarm and it will alert an emergency contact who can then come and help you back up again.

Another option that I often suggest is for people to attend one of the local falls prevention classes or exercise groups. These are dotted around the local area and focus on exercises that can help to improve overall fitness and balance. There are also chair based classes for those that may not be as mobile and most groups stay and have a social afterwards, so it is also an opportunity to meet with others.

Market Lavington Concert Band



A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

At a personal level, you may agree that relationships between partners should be a private matter. How the different members of a family get on together is generally not a subject to be discussed in public.

At a national level, however, family affairs are a matter of concern to us all. When a marriage between nations has been long and successful, the possibility that one partner may seek divorce is significant.

England and Scotland joined together in 1707. The couple had been engaged for over 100 years since the Union of the Crowns in 1603 and the intervening century had not been without incident but, by the early eighteenth century, the partners were ready for union and wedding vows were sealed willingly by the respective parliaments.

The early years of marriage were not without some problems, notably the Jacobite Rebellions of 1715 and 1745, but for most of the following three centuries the two countries have got on together pretty well. Indeed, there is probably no family of nations in history that has been more successful than the United Kingdom, Irish independence notwithstanding. The extended family of the Commonwealth continues to be the envy of much of the world. Even the rebellious child America, which stormed off in a huff in 1776, remains on good terms.

Three hundred years of marriage have bonded Scotland and England pretty closely together. Business links are deeply entangled. For example, our local electricity supplier, Scottish & Southern, is headquartered in Perth. South West Trains is part of Stagecoach, also based in Perth, while First Great Western and First Bus are headquartered in Aberdeen. Standard Life is Scottish, as is much of Lloyds Bank group and almost all of RBS.

Our former MP, Michael Ancram, is a Scotsman and now holds the title of Lord Lothian. James Gray, MP for North Wiltshire, was born and brought up in Glasgow and is the son of a former Moderator of the Church of Scotland. Personally, many of our friends and neighbours in Wiltshire are Scottish born and some of our closest English friends now live in Scotland.

Militarily, the countries of the United Kingdom are mutually dependent. Financially likewise. Disengaging Scotland from the UK will be challenging to say the least.

The referendum for Scottish independence is on 18th September. If the voters in Scotland chose Yes, the implications of the subsequent divorce will be momentous. I sincerely hope that a much-loved member of the UK family will decide to stay.

Speed-watch update

During the most recent week of monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through our village, our team monitored 449 vehicles travelling in excess of the 30mph speed limit.

The fastest was travelling at 53mph and many well above 40mph.

The difference of a few miles per hour can mean the difference between life and death. The faster someone is driving, the less time they have to stop if something unexpected happens.

If you kill someone while speeding, you will have to live with the long-term emotional consequences.

Speed limits are there for a reason.

The facts:

- Speed is one of the main factors in fatal road accidents
- In 2011, 3,267 people were killed or seriously injured in crashes where speed was a factor
- The risk of death is approximately four times higher when a pedestrian is hit at 40mph than at 30mph
- Fatal accidents are four times as likely on rural roads as urban roads

The law states that you must not drive faster than the speed limit for the type of road and your type of vehicle. The speed limit is the absolute maximum and it doesn't mean it's safe to drive at this speed in all conditions.
