# Letter from the Vicarage

When the business world starts promoting a spiritual technique there must be money in it. Meditation is big business these days because so many working days are lost through stress-related illnesses, and anything which relieves that stress must be good, it is said.

Of course, many of these practices are far from Christian, but meditation has been part of the Christian Church since its foundation. So what sets Christian meditation apart? Much Eastern meditation is an attempt to empty the mind whilst Christian meditation seeks to fill the mind. Many forms of Eastern meditation stress the need to become detached from the world and lose individuality; Christian meditation seeks a deeper attachment to God so we can be more effective in the world.

At a Lent group last week we considered meditation and one of the exercises we tried was specially appreciated. The key to this form of meditation is to utilise the imagination. We are so mind-focussed in our society today, so keen on thinking and reasoning skills, we are in danger of forgetting that God also gave us imagination, and properly used that can help bring us closer to Him.

Begin by choosing a short episode from the gospels. The aim is to immerse yourself in the scene, so you feel as well as hear what Jesus wants to say to you. Take, for example, the appearance of Jesus to the disciples in the upper room (very appropriate for this Easter month). It is in John's gospel, chapter 20 verses 19 to 22. Make yourself comfortable.

Read the passage two or three times slowly, so you know it fairly well.

Now imagine yourself in that room. It is late, the oil lamps are lit; you are with the disciples mulling over the events of the day. You are all perplexed; this has been like no other day. You are frightened, (the text says the doors were locked because you are afraid of the authorities). Listen to the conversation from the groups as they sit around the room. Feel the atmosphere; the warmth, the semi-darkness, the emotion.

Then, listen as the conversation dies away and the atmosphere changes. The reason becomes clear – there is someone else in the room – it is Jesus himself. He speaks to you all; "peace be with you". And you feel the peace; there is no need to fear, Jesus is really here! He shows you the wounds in his hands and side to quell the last few doubts. The fear is now replaced by joy, hard to believe, but true. The man you saw die a few days ago is now alive again. Feel what that joy is like.

"Peace be with you", Jesus says again. And then He does something very personal. He moves round the group. He breathes on each one and says "receive the Holy Spirit", the very power of God. Imagine that when Jesus reaches you, you know that He is asking 'what do you want me to do for you?"

So what will you say to Him? And your response is to say to Jesus: 'And what do you want me to do for you?' You may be surprised at what you hear.

Take your time with this meditation, don't force anything, just be in the situation and be open to what God will say.

A joyful Easter to you all.

#### What's happening on the Farm!

Is spring finally here? Well it certainly feels like it at the moment! With the fields drying up we are able to get out on them and carry out some of the spring time jobs that need to be done.

Last week we took delivery of the artificial fertiliser. In between the morning jobs, and getting dairy cattle ready for market, I have been applying the fertiliser to all the fields on the farm. We use artificial fertilisers as well as manure to maximise the productivity of every field. Manure spread on the fields over the winter months takes time to break down which means the nutrients in the dung are not readily available to the crops; it is a long term supply of nutrients. Whereas the artificial fertilisers (which are either prills or granular) are readily available to the crops because as soon as they hit the ground they are there for the crops to use.

At the beginning of the spring we always like to repair any broken or damaged fences around the grazing fields ready for the season ahead. This meant a trip during the week to Honeystreet saw mills to collect some bundles of fencing stakes and barbed wire. This is another time consuming but necessary job that we have started to do now the fields are drying up.

The calf with a broken leg is doing well; she had her cast off last week. The vet informed us that it has repaired itself. However to make sure that the leg is fully mended the cast was loosely put back on for another two weeks. This also allows the leg to flex and for the calf to start putting

weight back on the leg.

With the growing season and the wild bird breeding season now upon us I would like to ask all dog walkers to respect this. Please keep your dogs on leads and keep to the footpaths. It is very important that we give all hedgerow and ground nesting birds a chance to breed as well as my crops a chance to grow. Let's hope this weather continues throughout April. Robert Goss

#### **Financial Spring Clean**

At the heart of your community

One of my favourite tasks when visiting people in the course of my work, is saving people money. Could you save money on any of your bills? I have recently overhauled my own finances and saved money on my electricity, phone calls and insurance.

With regard to your electric or gas bills - could your current supplier put you on a cheaper tariff? All it takes is one phone call to them and you could be better off. Alternatively you could switch supplier and save. If you buy oil, could you join an oil buying syndicate and save money? There are a number of syndicates around, including one run by Community First.

Are you on the best phone package? I recently rang my supplier and told them I was paying too much. They halved my monthly bill straight away.

If you have been with the same insurance company for years, you might well be able to save by switching to a different insurer. If you tell your current insurer you are thinking of leaving, they may give you a significant discount. To change insurer you can visit a broker or, if you have access to the internet, get quotes on line. You could save on your contents, buildings or car insurance.

Also check that you are claiming all the benefits that you are entitled to. These include Attendance Allowance, Pension Credit, Council tax and Housing benefit. If your financial situation changes (for example, your spouse dies or your savings fall) it could be worth having your benefits re-assessed.

#### FIVE LANES CE VC PRIMARY SCHOOL

#### Sport at Five Lanes

Throughout our school the children have access to high quality PE sessions for two hours each week. As they get older there are teams in which they can play competitively against other schools. We encourage all children to become involved and, to that end, each term there are a range of clubs which have recently included netball, dance, hockey and tag rugby.

We are part of the Devizes School Sports Partnership. A PE teacher from Devizes School has worked with the children at KS1 and those in Y3 and Y4 at the KS2 site, coaching in Dance and Gymnastics so far this year. The children have learnt new skills and really enjoyed each session. The teachers are able to watch an expert and develop their own subject knowledge. Each term has culminated in an event for all the local schools belonging to the partnership. The recent Circus Skills event was thoroughly enjoyed by all the children who took part.

The children in Y5 and Y6 have coaching from the staff at Dauntsey's School during which they learn skills to use in tournaments hosted at the school. This opportunity to play against teams from several schools is a fantastic experience for the children.

We currently have two netball teams playing in the Devizes Primary School League. Each time they play we are hugely impressed by their teamwork and resilience and, of course, the support received from parents and other family members.

The children in KS2 go swimming each week at Melksham Blue Pool where they receive excellent teaching from the staff at the pool. They develop skills in swimming on their front and their back and spend some time learning about basic water survival.

#### A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

It's not just young people who seem to spend an inordinate amount of time in front of a computer these days. I do, and you may be the same.

The fact is that many of us rely on computers and the internet to fulfill our daily duties and to communicate with others. The efficiency of the internet, therefore, is pretty important to our lives.

At present, not all areas within Wiltshire have access to broadband with some areas experiencing slow speeds and poor service. If you are in one of those areas, you are sure to know it!

In fact, 11% of premises in Wiltshire cannot access even 2mb. Poor broadband services are a major obstacle to economic growth and investment. Limited access to broadband restricts individuals and families in accessing online services such as educational activities,, communication, entertainment, shopping and paying bills.

Wiltshire is spending many millions of pounds to bring superfast broadband of over 24mb to 91% or more premises in the next few years. Nobody will have less than 2mb.

The way that the improvements are made is to lay fibre optic cables from exchanges that already have a fibre link to those that don't. This involves surveying the conduits to ensure that they can accommodate the new cable. It is a huge task as some conduits are very old and in poor condition, others have been rerouted for some reason and the drawings have not been kept up to date, and some are simply not big enough. It's only when the surveys have been completed that the roll out can be started.

The good news is that the installations for our area are scheduled to start by the end of this year. You will be able to track what is happening on the Wiltshire Council website at <u>http://www.wiltshireonline.org/index.php/broadband-rollout</u>

#### ARTICLE FOR THE BRIDGE, APRIL 2014 EDITION WORTON PARISH COUNCIL OUT AND ABOUT

Spring has definitely 'sprung' and the rains seem (well, almost) far away. At its March meeting the Council considered how the water in our ditches and watercourses could be better managed, prompted not least by new Byelaws set out by Wiltshire Council for landowners to consider, and by knowledge that parishes further downstream have put arrangements in place to improve their own surroundings. We know several homes have suffered in this parish, and we are pleased to report that at this Council's request Highways engineers have visited and will be arranging some remedial clearing out of drains and gulleys leading off the highway – but if a gulley or pipe then lies under private land, it must be cleared by the landowner.

Still on the subject of Spring, and as we look forward to getting out a little more, the Council is pleased to report that it is to receive a grant from Aster Communities to fund the purchase of two public benches. Through consultation with residents in Cedar Close there has been support for the siting of one bench on the grassed area to the right of the Close. The other is to be placed on the Cuckold's Green bend, opposite the turning to Potterne.

#### VOLUNTEERS

Last month the Council appealed for volunteers to get involved in the life of the community. There is now another opportunity if you would like to support the continued provision of play equipment for our young children. The Parish Council provides two play areas, in Sandleaze and Whatleys Close. We would like to improve our management of these facilities, ensuring particularly that they remain safe and hazard-free. If you would like to help by joining a rota for looking at the equipment regularly then please contact our Clerk as below.

#### FUNDING

Finally, we know that Council Tax bills have arrived for 2014/15 and as announced in the February edition, you will see that the Parish Council's element of that bill has increased. This year the decision was taken to increase the precept by the equivalent of 75p per month for the equivalent Band D house, or £9 per year. This is the first increase since April 2011, and even then the budget rose by just £200. Over this time this represents an average increase of just £3 per year per Band D house, with this year's increase at less than half the average charge across all Wiltshire town and parish councils. With a small grant from Wiltshire Council included, the budget will now be £10,000 per year.

The Council can now plan ahead for a number of phased community projects, but most importantly introduce sustainable support for the Village Hall, which is seen as an essential component of village life. Other projects planned for the year include highways safety improvements that would not otherwise be funded by Wiltshire Council, replacement community notice boards, and provision for maintain-

ing rights of way. Parking control lines are already marked out for painting as the weather permits. We continue to pursue other forms of income, and another grant application has been made for the provision of a defibrillator – more information to follow on this life-saving opportunity, if this proves successful. AND...

And really finally, thank you to those good neighbours that have been siting wheelie bins away from the pavement in response to requests to avoid creating obstructions. Together with approaches made to the refuse collectors themselves, there has been a noticeable improvement for pedestrians.

After our 7 April meeting in the school, our next meeting will be the Annual Meeting of the Council on **Tuesday 6 May** – not our usual evening, but avoiding the bank holiday. The Annual Parish Meeting will be on **Monday 12 May** in The Village Hall – all are invited to this opportunity for the whole community to come together, with councillors and the Trustees of the Village Hall present, and get involved in shaping the future.

Yesterday, 18<sup>th</sup> February 2014, saw another tragic story unfold before our eyes as six day old Eliza-Mae Mullane died as a result of her injuries inflicted upon her by the family dog.

This time by an Alaskan Malamute, who has been described as being gentle with children.

The Dog Safety Education Executive share the distress that the rest of the nation feel about this heartbreaking story and, as parents and fellow dog lovers, extend their greatest of sympathies with the Mullane family.

Regardless of how lovely a dog is and how much we think we can trust them, we can never forget that accidents happen. Babies have an irresistible smell about them to dogs and it's natural for dogs to want to investigate the smell; toddlers can fall or stand on dogs and if we're not there to step in when it happens, especially when dogs are asleep, then instinct can take over and an automatic 'snap' can follow.

The majority of bites incurred to children are as a result of an accident rather than because of a dog being 'vicious', and so DogSEE urge all dog owners that have children in the home to take sensible precautions concerning the management of dog and child. If in any way, you are concerned about the dog, seek professional help immediately.

In the same way we would be mindful of accidents happening with a boiling pan of water on a hob or an open fire, so too we need to be mindful of accidents happening with our much loved pet dogs, and so rather than take a risk, please take the dog (or the child) with you when you leave the room.
