

Letter from the Vicarage

Today the news is dominated again by events in the Middle East, this time Israel and Gaza. An Egyptian peace proposal has just been rejected, rockets have rained down in Israel and in return, another seven people have died in air strikes on Gaza.

Our politicians seem helpless, and sometimes hopeless, in the face of huge and very complicated problems. Who would have thought that the very people some in this country wanted to arm against President Assad in Syria would turn up a few months later as the new enemy, Isis, in Iraq? It's hard to know who's who. So, is there any cause at all for hope?

In 'thought for the day' this morning, the speaker made a comparison between the Middle East today and Europe 100 years ago, because then it was our continent which was about to descend into the bloodiest war the world had yet seen . This month sees the commemoration of the centenary of the outbreak of World War 1. The twentieth century was a dark period for Europe with millions killed in two world wars, and millions more under communism later in the century.

Perhaps someone looking at this continent in 1916 or 1942 would have concluded there was little reason for hope ever to return to Europe. How could these nations ever get on together, or even tolerate one another? And yet, last week many people in this country turned to support Germany in the World Cup after the early England exit. It may be a simplistic illustration, but it shows that new starts are possible, and firm friendships can be forged from what were once deep hostilities.

The Christian faith is a religion of hope. We know that our God is able to raise up hope from despair and life from death. That is what the cross of Jesus is all about, and the cross is at the heart of our faith. Even when the evidence of our eves seems to tell us otherwise, we believe that our God of love is still able to bring about reconciliation and new beginnings. How will that happen in the situations we face today? I have no idea, but then people had no idea how the world wars would end, or how the Iron Curtain could ever be dismantled. But end they did, the Berlin Wall was torn down, and a new world order came Is it better than the old one? about Probably not, because the heart of people is still fundamentally selfish (sinful is the Bible word for it), but God can change the human heart. Our job is simply to preach the good news of God's love in Jesus, believing in His power to change individuals. We have seen the light break through before, and we will see it again. There may not seem many grounds for optimism, but there are always grounds for hope, for God is always to be trusted.

Whilst putting names to faces isn't as easy as I at first hoped (there are almost 100), I am trying to speak with someone new every time I go and hopefully it won't be long before I can take everyone's orders without hesitation!

The reason I enjoy these so much isn't just because of the amazing food and more than reasonable prices, but because of the friendly and welcoming atmosphere at each and every one. After the initial shock of seeing someone so young enter and sit at the table, I have been made to feel incredibly welcome and I have enjoyed the conversation and banter at all of them. These lunch clubs are great places to meet new people, eat good food and learn a little about the local area (or a lot in my case!). Dementia Friends - Recently I became a 'Dementia Friend.' Whilst this may sound quite formal and arduous, it was as simple as meeting with a group of others in someone's sitting room and learning a little about what it may be like to live with dementia. We discussed how we can help those around us that may have the condition and at the end everyone was asked to commit to an action that would ensure our new found knowledge and understanding extend past the four walls of the room.

I learnt the importance of patience and positivity in our interactions with those with the condition and about the social groups that meet all across the county, including **Singing for the Brain, Movement for the Mind** and the **Carers Support** group that have been set up to support both those with the condition and those that care for them.

The aim of Dementia Friends is to raise understanding of the condition and becoming a dementia friend is very simple and costs nothing. 

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

What's the point of studying history? Any school child may ask that question as they try to put Romans, Anglo Saxons, Vikings, Normans, etc into some sort of order.

I remember spending many lessons on the English Civil War when we learnt that Cavaliers were wrong but romantic while Roundheads were right but repulsive. Curiously, I was taught nothing about the Victorians, although that period marked a pinnacle in British power and progress.

This year, historical recall has received a public prominence that I have not seen in my lifetime. The centenary of the start of the First World War in August 1914 has a poignancy that is unmatched by other anniversaries, and rightly so - Lest we Forget.

But is history just a narrative or can we learn from it as a guide for our own time and a pointer to the future? It seems to me that there are an alarming number of parallels to be drawn between then and now.

In 1914, Britain was the predominant superpower controlling a global empire, being challenged by an economically resurgent Germany seeking its own place in the sun. Britain was democratic while Germany was more autocratic. Today, the supremacy of the democratic United States is increasingly challenged by the rise of an autocratic China.

In 1914, the critical trouble spot was the Balkans, where nationalist passions were overlaid with religious conflicts. Austria-Hungary, run by Roman Catholic Habsburgs and backed by Germany, was being challenged by Orthodox Serbia backed by Russia and France. Currently it is the conflicts in the Middle East we have to worry about, with vicious turmoil in Syria and Iran between rival Islamic factions standing proxy for the rivalry between Shia Iran and Sunni Saudi Arabia, with Israel a serious side issue. And then there is Ukraine.

Such tensions may be the triggers of war - an assassination, perhaps, or an airliner shot down.

1914 was also a hot summer. Henley Regatta and Ascot took place much as now. Cricket was played at Lords and tennis at Wimbledon. I hope the comparisons go no further but the suggestion that the end of the Cold War in 1989 marked the triumph of liberal democracy and the end of history is, sadly, wrong!

What's happening on the farm!

Well after a few very busy months for us on the farm, I was unable to meet the last deadline for the magazine. So I am going to have to fit in two months' worth of news in one month's write up.

Firstly, all the hay making is complete; we made just over 60 acres of top quality hay that will be used to help complement the cattle's diet over the winter months. Father and I both said it was very unusual to make over 60 acres of hay all at once with the British weather actually being kind to us for once!

At the beginning of June it was time to fly spray all the cattle. This is done every four weeks over the summer months at Sandleaze Farm. This involves putting all the cattle through the handling crush and putting a clear, oily liquid (known as fly pour) along every animal's back. Once the fly pour has soaked in, it gives the animal one month's protection against flies, fleas and mange. In the hot summer weather if we did not fly spray the cattle the flies would not leave the cattle alone and in some cases can cause illness.

I have some fantastic news about the English partridges, they have successfully bred. One pair hatched seven chicks however due to predators this pair are down to three half grown partridges. Father saw them in one of the fields feeding just yesterday. By the looks of it another pair of the English partridges have successfully bred too; they were out with several baby chicks behind them. This is such a great achievement as the English partridge is becoming a rare sight in the English countryside.

Some more great news about the wildlife in our area, the barn owl has made its return. We were loading up the dairy heifers as they were going to market early one Saturday morning and it came swooping over us and flew low all across the field looking for food. Since then it has been spotted by us and by many others in the village several times. What a great sight to see. Robert Goss



WORTON PARISH COUNCIL (WPC)

Road Safety - We are very pleased that Wiltshire Council agreed to implement a number of road safety changes in our village. There will be a crossing point near Cedar Close and the school, a designated area for the Lavington School bus opposite Sandleaze and red tarmac with SLOW at the western end of the village, all of which are planned for October. Our request for a reduced speed limit has been agreed for the eastern end of the village and on up to the Black Dog crossroads, but not for the western end of the village. By the time you read this, we will have lodged an appeal against the decision and approached Claire Perry MP, so please be assured that WPC will continue its campaign to improve road safety until we are satisfied that all necessary steps have been taken to protect residents.

As part of the process to improve road safety, we learnt that unless the police attend an accident (and they will only do so if there has been an injury or significant traffic disruption) the accident will not be recorded in the road safety statistics. Apparently it was the lack of RECORDED accidents at the western end of the village that contributed to the decision not to reduce the speed limit. Therefore, we ask all residents to record accidents; take the registration number, note the time, date and weather conditions, take a photo if possible and then give this data to any member of WPC.

Whatleys Close Playground - We have removed the swings at the Whatleys Close playground because the wooden posts are rotting at the base of the swing supports, so apologies to any disappointed younger residents. However, there are swings, a climbing frame and slide, a see-saw and a roundabout at Sandleaze to keep you entertained over the summer and a new picnic bench is being delivered soon. If you have ideas on how the playgrounds could be developed please come along and share them with us at the September meeting (no meeting in August).

Defibrillator - Margaret and Keith at the Rose and Crown have kindly agreed for the defibrillator to be mounted on an external wall. So you should see this over the summer holidays. Once in place, there is an invitation to all villagers to meet with South Western Ambulance Service to learn basic first aid and how to use the defibrillator - although the defibrillator is fully automated and would 'talk' anyone who had to use it through the simple procedure. This event will be from September onwards, so look out for the date. Thanks again to Aster Communities for funding this item for our village.

Footpath Clearance - Worton Parish Council is actively working with villagers to keep footpaths clear for the benefit of all parishioners. A sample section of the Worton to Marston footpath has been cleared to reveal sound tarmac beneath. Therefore, the entire footpath between the Church and the bridge will be cleared which will improve access for all. Please look out for invitations to join in these events.

Himalayan Balsam and Japanese Knotweed - These Victorian introductions are devastating our native plants, fauna, insects and animals so please be vigilant and take action if you spot any. There is Himalayan Balsam along the stream banks in our parish so could land owners please remove it before the seeds burst (each plant can produce 800 seeds!). Thank you to the vigilant parishioner who spotted a Japanese Knotweed look-alike in Back Lane. Fortunately, it was not Japanese Knotweed - but it could have been! Take a look at the Worton website for more information on both of these pretty but highly invasive plants.

Thank you for your support - We enjoy the increased contribution from parishioners who join us for all or part of the meetings and look forward to our next meeting on Monday 1st September at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

Christ Church PCC Meeting

The Parochial Church Council of Christ Church discussed the following at their meeting on Wednesday 16 July:

1. A new Child Protection Officer for the church has been identified and a notice confirming her appointment will be put up in due course.

2. The wording of a plaque in memory of Anne Shand has been agreed and this will be attached to the organ which was restored in her honour.

3. The high cost of electricity remains a problem and investigations will be made to ensure that we are getting the best deal.

4. A fire risk assessment has been made and notices, and other steps requested by the insurers, implemented.

5. The new start time for services at Christ Church, which now commence at 9.30am each Sunday, for a trial period to December, seems to be becoming accepted. Only a few objections have been raised, compared to many supportive comments.

6. A major discussion took place on the subject of attempting to meet the spiritual needs of those known to be supportive of the church and its work, but not regular or frequent worshippers. This is a very vexed (and common) problem for rural churches, with no easy solution, but attempts to try to bridge the gap between the perceived needs and the church's offering will continue.


