

Letter from the Vicarage



Two recent government initiatives have sparked a flurry of comment. One is to run tube trains in London 24 hours a day; the other is to relax Sunday trading restrictions. Both are designed to 'increase economic growth'. Unions object, saying their members would be forced to work even if they did not want to, and the speaker on Thought For The Day recently urged us all to consider spiritual principles, not just economics. In fact, he said, economics taken alone have caused many of the problems in society today, encouraging dissatisfaction and unhappiness as a result of what he called 'craving'.

The answer of course, is to be found in an attitude of contentment, and that is not related to wealth or lack of it. I have known poor and rich people who are content, and poor and rich people who are not.

St Paul in the Bible describes contentment as being linked to godliness. "We brought nothing into the world", he says, "and we can take nothing out."

The big question for us all is this: Will your goal in life really bring you contentment or not?

I think that if you are aiming at material things - a bigger house or better car, you are doomed to live forever on a treadmill which will never satisfy. Maybe your goal is linked to family or friends. That is better, but again human beings have a habit of letting us down, no matter how good they may be. Because none of us is immortal, ultimately everyone will find themselves without someone they love, the hardest of all losses to bear.

That is why St Paul links contentment with godliness.

'God created us for himself, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in him.' That famous quote from St Augustine sums up the route to real contentment for the Christian, and, in my opinion, for us all.

God is the only one who has not and never will let us down. He is the source of love, beauty and joy. It is in knowing Him that real fulfilment is found.

So is there anything wrong in wanting to better yourself? Not at all, as long as you never lose your perspective and think things you buy will make you content. They have a nasty habit of doing just the opposite. Anything money can buy will one day pass away, only the things of the Spirit will last forever.

I have to say, I understand the reservations of those anxious about these new initiatives. Human beings need time set apart for rest and relaxation and this does not appear to help. At the least, they should come with a health warning: 'Beware, concentrating on economic growth at the expense of everything else can seriously damage your health'.



Village Hall Refurbishment

We have a bit more information to give you on the refurbishment of the Village Hall. The tender has been awarded to Gaigers Bros. Ltd. and will start on (or around) September 7th with an end date of October 30th if the weather is kind to us. Obviously, as all the work is external, this may slip if we have a wet autumn, so fingers crossed for dry weather. Tim Weeding will be acting as Project manager for us.

Whilst the work is being undertaken, the hall will be surrounded with Harris fencing to secure the site. For some of the time at least it will also be covered in scaffolding. Unfortunately no one will be able to use the hall during the day and those regular hirers who do, have been notified. We have offered to help them in any way we can to find alternative arrangements during this period and to move equipment etc. The hall will be able to be used in the evening by groups as long as we can give Gaigers the date on which it is required. They will then secure it in a fashion that allows safe entry and exit. We will not be taking any additional bookings for September or October though.

Gaigers Bros. staff will need to use the car park in front of the hall for their vehicles (about three) and possibly for a skip. We have been assured that noise level and dust etc. will not be excessive.

Gaigers are keen to work with us to limit any disruption and hopefully the end product of a hall fit for purpose will compensate for any that is unavoidable. Should you have any concerns about the work, please contact Veronica Franklin, Chair of Trustees on 726845. Thank you to everyone who has supported us so far in this endeavour through encouragement, advice and fundraising. We still have some money to raise but we are waiting to hear the outcome of a number of grant applications - so again fingers crossed.



A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

After my last Message with its historical theme, one resident wrote to me to suggest that I should concentrate more on current local issues. I was, of course, pleased to learn that I had at least one reader!

As it happens, there are quite a number of current local issues. One topical subject is the question of where new housing developments should be located. The Core Strategy, adopted in January, requires sites for 210 more houses to be found in the Devizes Community Area outside the town itself. A Wiltshire Council study is underway to prepare a Housing Development Planning Document (DPD) that will report with proposals for consultation later this year.

The Core Strategy anticipates that some new housing should be built in local service centres (which in this Division means Market Lavington) and in large villages (West Lavington/Littleton Panell and Worton. There are other large villages in the community area). In small villages (Erlestoke, Great Cheverell and Marston), infill only is allowed. Little Cheverell, for these purposes, is classified as "open countryside" where development would be permitted on an exception basis only.

It is appropriate that residents in Market Lavington and in West Lavington/ Littleton Panell might wish to influence where the anticipated new housing should go and both communities are preparing Neighbourhood Plans, with which your engagement is welcome. Worton is also actively considering the possibility of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan.

It would be unwise of me to suggest that small villages and the open countryside are free from the risk of more than minimal development but the odds are stacked against an ambitious developer. As evidence, you need look no further than Great Cheverell where Gladman Homes had sought to put an estate of 25 houses on a green field outside the village against local wishes and all current planning policies. Fortunately, in May a planning inspector rejected their appeal against Wiltshire Council's refusal of planning permission.

The question arises, however, as to how small villages, etc. might get developments that they <u>do</u> want. Such developments could provide housing for local families and could generate capital funds for local facilities through Community Infrastructure Levy payments and "section 106" contributions. For this reason, Erlestoke, Great Cheverell and Little Cheverell are all considering preparing a Neighbourhood Plan, perhaps working together for this purpose.

I commend all those who are contributing to these activities. A Neighbourhood Plan is no small task. At the end of the process, all residents in the respective communities who are registered to vote will be able to take part in a referendum before the Plans can be adopted. I hope they will be supported.

What's happening on the farm!

After a couple of busy months silaging and hay making, harvest is about to begin. Although we do not grow any cereal crops, this will still be a busy period for us as we buy the straw from a local arable farmer on Salisbury Plain and haul it back to Home Farm on trailers where it will be stored in our newly constructed straw barn. It will be stored and kept dry until we need to use it.

In June we fly sprayed all the heifers here at Home Farm. During the summer months flies can cause certain infections and illnesses that can make the cattle very ill so we bring the cattle back in from the fields group by group and individually pour the fly spray along each animal's back. How much the animal weighs usually determines how much fly spray needs to be used. This gives the heifers 8 weeks protection against flies. The procedure will have to be repeated in August to make sure the cattle have the full protection over the summer.

July has been filled with various summertime jobs along with attending cattle sales both buying and selling dairy heifers. Father went to a sale a few weeks ago where the Kington Magna herd was being sold. This herd is renowned, winning local and national shows with many of their animals. He came home with six, one of which is a potential show calf. I may have to talk my little brother into showing her at one of the local shows around here and see if we can win a rosette!

I was talking to a neighbouring farmer recently who has had a case of Neosporosis diagnosed on his farm. He has asked me to ask you all whilst walking your dogs, not only in Worton and Marston but wherever you walk them, please pick up your dog poo and dispose of it in the appropriate manner. Although scientists are working on a vaccine (in a laboratory in New Zealand) there is no known cure.


I am sure most people's bbqs have been pulled out the shed, dusted off and put to good use already but remember when buying meat for the bbq, buy British and support your farmers.

WORTON PARISH COUNCIL VILLAGE SURVEY - THE RESULTS

The council carried out a survey of the Parish during April / May this year. This was as a result of the actions promised at last year's Annual Parish meeting in May 2014. The aim being to gather local opinions regarding the future of the village and creating a possible plan or strategy.

There were 275 responses; an overwhelming response demonstrating peoples interest in the issues! In order to get a comprehensive analysis of the responses, a report was commissioned and has now been completed.

The report is 17 pages long and is clearly too large to publish in its entirety in the 'Bridge'. However the full report will be available on the Worton Parish Council web site: www.worton.org.uk

However I felt that as there was such an overwhelming and positive response to the survey that I would put a brief summary of some of the key findings in the Bridge.

ROADS

Not surprisingly speeding traffic and volume of vehicles was identified as a key issue.

67% wanted a 20mph limit through the village.

38% wanted a 50mph limit from the west end of the village to Seend.

42% suggested a wide range of other traffic related issues, of which 33% wanted traffic calming measures.

BUS SERVICE

47% of those who use the local bus services are over 55 years of age.

Of the 66 people who use the bus service, 35 stated that they are happy with the service, while 26 indicated they are not happy with the service. There was a sizable desire to have more frequent services.

YOUNG PEOPLE / LOCAL SCHOOL

34 respondents have children under 11 years old, but only 13 respondents indicated that their children went to Five Lanes School or Village Hall toddlers group.

However 12% of respondents indicated that their 12-18 year olds would take part in a Parish Youth Council.

HOUSES

In any long term planning for the future of the village, housing is a vital and sensitive issue, so a number of questions were asked in the survey about this. A detailed analysis of the results is contained in the 17 page report, however a summary of some key findings are as follows:

Some respondents specified the types of housing they would like to see. A full summary of these are in the 17 page report however a few of the comments quotes are as follows:

LIKE AND DISLIKE / WANTED AND NOT WANTED IN WORTON

The top two issues were identified for the following four questions. Specific comments about these issues and a detailed breakdown of all the other issues raised is contained in the 17 page report. E.G 'Do not want' issues contained comments & concerns about large scale housing development and additional traffic. 'Wish had' issues contained comments about wanting a shop / Post Office.

The Parish Council hopes to arrange a Village Hall open evening / day in the autumn where residents can add any additional thoughts on the results of the survey. It will also be an opportunity for residents to detail their ideas for the future of the village. These combined with the survey will form the basis of a possible long term vision / plan for Worton.
