Alton Priors

Alton Priors, is a small village and chapelry, in the parish of Overton, Southern division of the county, hundred of Elstub and Everleigh, Everleigh, Pewsey union, Marlborough county court district, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts and rural deanery of Avebury, situated near the Kennet and Avon canal, 7 miles east from Devizes, 8 south-west from Marlborough, and 4 north-west from Pewsey. The church is an old stone building, with square tower and 1 bell. The register dates from 1664. The living is a vicarage, annexed to those of Overton and Fyfield, joint annual value £310, in the gift of the Duke of Marlborough, and held by the Rev. William J. B. Angell, of Queen's College, Oxford. Head Pottinger Best, Esq. (who is the lord of the manor), and James George Simpkins, Esq., are chief landowners. The soil is clay; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and beans. The area is 2,630 acres, and the population in 1861 was 207.

WEST STOWELL is a tithing. On the downs, to the north, are barrows: on the side of one of the downs has been formed a singular figure of a white horse, which, from its immense proportions, is a conspicuous object for many miles; it is more than a stone's throw from head to tail; when close to the obj4ect no resemblance to the animal can be traced, but at a distance from it the shape b4ecomes perfect.
