## **Woollen Articles Distributed in 1943**

Pullovers, 165; Socks, 250 pairs; Sea and Gum Boot Stockings, 22 Pairs; Gloves, 73 pairs; Scarf Helmets and Helmets, 22 Scarves, 52. Total 584, to 312 persons.

To 36 named Ships 4 Prisoners of War, 9 Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry, and all Theatres of War, Home and Abroad

January to April. 1944:- Pullovers, 76; Socks 72 pairs; Sea and Gum Boot Stockings, 15 Pairs; Gloves, 42 Pairs; Scarf Helmets, 24; Scarves, 35. Total 264, to 91 persons.

To 14 named Ships 1 Prisoner of War, 1 Royal Wilts Yeomanry.

Eleven parcels to Royal Wilts Yeomanry up to December 31st, 1942.

Total to date, 21 parcels
