Eastern Development Area

Draft supplementary planning guidance has been issued by Swindon Borough Council in an effort to control and steer future development of the Eastern Development Area (EDA).

The Guidance deals with matters such as highway and traffic issues, required infrastructure such as schools, shopping provision, play areas, open spaces as well as flood alleviation measures. Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has objected to the EDA proposals on the grounds that they are premature to the publication and adoption of the Swindon Transport Strategy and the Regional Spatial Strategy which has yet to be formally published and adopted. The Parish Council was concerned that the EDA should not be considered for any development until all the other areas within the Borough of Swindon currently being developed have been completed.

This includes land to the north of Swindon and the Front Garden. It was also felt that further development proposals for Swindon should not be considered until a full review of the Regional Spatial Strategy has been undertaken to ensure that the projected requirements actually meet the needs of the area, that the proposed housing requirements are relevant to the current economic climate and that any future proposals are not only viable but can be delivered in full with the required investment being available to significantly improve the existing infrastructure of the Borough in order to reduce the impact of an increase in population on

existing communities. The proposal will have a significant impact on the parish of Stratton St Margaret especially in traffic and highways terms as the current highway infrastructure is already operating over capacity. The proposals will also create a strain on current infrastructure and existing leisure provision and will adversely affect the quality of life of its residents. Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has urged Swindon Borough Council to carry out further consultation on the EDA proposals once all the relevant documents relating to this supplementary planning document have formally been adopted and published.

Update - Headlands School/Merton Fields

Swindon Borough Council continues to press ahead with redevelopment proposals for the former Headlands School site.

Swindon Borough Council continues to press ahead with redevelopment proposals for the former Headlands School site. The site is to be developed in phases. Phase One will focus on the development of the Sports Centre and accompanying land and will include the demolition of the existing school building but the retention of the sports building and gymnasium element. It is expected that the pupils will vacate the site in December 2009 with vacant possession of the site and the new lease coming into force by the end of December 2009. Demolition of the old school building

should commence at the beginning of January 2010 at the latest and will take approximately one month to complete. The Esprit Gymnastics Club has been given a 25 year lease for the sports hall complex and accompanying land. Further improvements will take place to the gymnastics facility including a proposed extension of the gymnasium to Olympic standards potentially funded in the main by Sport England. It was the intention of Swindon Borough Council that the site be used to its full potential during the economic downturn which included the use of the existing sports pitches. Swindon Borough Leisure Services are expected to submit a plan for

the sports pitches and will include junior and mini football pitches with teams using the existing changing rooms. With regard to the residential proposals nothing to date has been progressed but the Environment Agency had accepted proposals to address the potential flooding issues and had been involved in designing an attenuation pool to be sited by the existing sub station to help alleviate flooding. Full public consultation on Phase One will be carried out in July 2009 prior to the school holidays so that local residents would be fully informed of the Borough Council's plans regarding demolition and immediate future usage of the site.

Open Spaces Master Plan

Presenting initial proposals for the revamping of the play areas in the parish of Stratton St Margaret

Over the past few months David Jarvis Associates has been drafting initial proposals for the revamping of the play areas in the parish of Stratton St Margaret. At a recent Recreation Committee meeting a presentation of some of the ideas being considered was given to the Committee.

As part of the parish council's commitment to identify additional allotment land it has been suggested that part of the Meadowcroft playing field be given over to creating 20 additional allotment plots (Fig 1).

At the Melford Walk Play Area a new path network and additional play surfacing has been put forward for consideration. (Fig 2) Additional paths and equipment are also suggested.

There are various restrictions regarding possible improvements to Merton Fields but one area that seems to be crying out for a little TLC is the large tarmac area. Initial suggestions include a pergola and additional plantings round this area to soften it up a little and the creation of a pond to help address some of the flooding issues in this area (Fig 3).

All the initial sketch proposals can be viewed on the Council's website and residents and users of the play areas are encouraged to comment upon the proposals. What about a bandstand at Merton Fields? Or a skate Park on the Stephen's Road play area? Or a 3G all weather surface at Stratton Community Leisure Centre?

The draft sketch schemes are currently being revised to take on board initial comments received from Councillors and a full public consultation process will be undertaken in September and will be launched at the "Your Stratton" Open Day on Saturday 5th September 2009. So if you want to input into the process please send your views and comments to Stratton St Margaret Parish Council.

The Parish Plan

Sadly this project has stalled for the time being for a variety of reasons. However, it is hoped to be back on track by the end of July and well under way by September! Councillor Vacancies

We still have two Councillor vacancies! This means that instead of 23 Councillors representing the parish residents we only have 21. So if you fancy being directly involved in your community or you know someone who you think would make a smashing Councillor just get in touch with us and request an application form. There is no standing for election and you do not need to be a member of a political party. Vacancies will be filled by co-option following consideration of applications by Full Council.

New MUGA at Greenbridge

The proposals for a new MUGA at the Dorcan Playing Fields, Greenbridge, are close to coming to fruition. The project which is being overseen by Swindon Borough Council, has been delayed slightly due to amended procurement procedures adopted by the Borough but it is hoped that work will commence in the near future to install the eagerly awaited Multi Use Games Area.

Architectural Feasibility

Study for Stratton

Community Leisure Centre

At the meeting of the Community Centre Committee held on 23rd June 2009 it was agreed to appoint S&P Architects to carry out a feasibility study of the Leisure Centre. The study will help identify and direct possible future investments in the centre and suggest improvements in the use of existing space. S&P Architects are the UK's largest sport and leisure specialist architects and have been consulting in the sport and leisure field for 30 years. Working alongside them on this project will be Sports Solutions GB based in South Marston.

Accounts and Audit Regulations 2003 Regulations 13, 14 & 16

The Council's accounts are subject to external audit by the Audit Commission of Westward House, Lime Kiln Close, Stoke Gifford, Bristol BS34 8SU (ref. Mr. M Robinson). Members of the public and local government electors have certain rights in the audit process:

1. From 3 August 2009 to 21 August 2009 between 10 am and 4pm (Monday to Friday) any person may inspect the accounts of the Council for the year ended 31 March 2009 and certain related documents (comprising books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers and receipts) at the address given below (Ref Mr P. Russell). They may also make copies of the accounts and documents.
2. From 24 August 2009 until the conclusion of the audit process, a local government elector for the area of the Council, or his/her representative, may ask the auditor questions about the accounts. Please contact the auditor at the address given above to make arrangements to ask any questions.
3. From 24 August 2009 until the conclusion of the audit process, a local government elector for the area of the Council, or his/her representative, may object to the Council's accounts asking that the auditor issue a report in the public interest (under section 8 of the Audit Commission Act 1998) and/or apply to the court for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law (under section 17 of the Audit Commission Act 1998). Written notice of a proposed objection and the grounds on which it is made must be sent to the auditor at the address given above and copied to the Clerk of the Council.

Focus On...The Community Centre Committee

The Community Centre Committee meets once a month at present to review the daily running and performance of both the Stratton Community Leisure Centre in Grange Drive and the Meadowcroft Community Rooms.

The Stratton Community Leisure Centre is more commonly known as The Grange and provides a range of activities including a Health and Fitness Suite, which has recently been upgraded quite significantly and offers great value for money. There are two squash courts and a four badminton court sized sports hall where a range of activities take place including 5-a-side football, badminton, aerobic classes and musical events. Then there is the Stratton Suite which is frequently used for wedding receptions, birthday parties and conferences. Finally there is the Members' Bar which serves good quality well priced food and drink.

The Centre organises holiday clubs for children. These provide a variety of activities to suit a range of ages that have proved very popular.

However, the Centre does require an

annual subsidy and the Committee is working extremely hard to try to reduce this burden on both the Council and local Tax Payers. The Committee is chaired by Cllr Gerry Lawson and the Vice Chair is Cllr Philip Steele. Every meeting is open to the public and there is an opportunity to address the committee if you would like to ask them about any matters relating to

the Community Centre.

The Meadowcroft Community Rooms play host to a number of local organisations including the Beechcroft Thursday Club and the Luncheon Club as well as providing a useful venue for local bands to practice and organisations to meet. It is also where the Parish Council holds its weekly meetings.

News From The Stratton Community Beat Manager



My name is WPC Lisa Draper 1861 and I am the Community Beat Manager for Stratton St Margaret. During recent months I have

noticed an increase in Anti-Social Behaviour at the Stratton Community Leisure Centre and surrounding areas.

The neighbourhood team does patrol these areas regularly and details of the main offenders are taken. However we are asking for your help as this issue affects us all.

If you have children and you know that they socialise in the evenings with their friends please take 5 minutes to remind them of the right way to behave and the consequences of Anti-Social Behaviour.

Damaging property, leaving litter, drinking alcohol, shouting and swearing at any time especially late at night are not acceptable and will not be tolerated. We can issue Acceptable Behaviour Contracts to repeat offenders and these can stipulate where they may go, with whom and at what times. Breaking these contracts can lead to an Anti Social Behavioural Order which I am sure you have heard of.

We do not want to issue these to any children and youths in the area but we will do so if their behaviour deems it necessary.
