week, however, Ann and I were walking when Pip picked up the scent of a hare. The hare ran with dog in hot pursuit! Then a second hare broke cover and my whistling was useless. Pip's animal instincts had taken over and eventually in her own time, she trotted back exhausted.

I want to draw together three things

First is my dog. Pip is normally well

behaved and comes to my whistle. Last

Second is Coronation Street (ves. I know it's sad!) There are two characters at the moment who are behaving like my dog – obeying their animal instincts. Both got into situations they knew were wrong and would lead to disaster, but neither had the strength to stand up to temptation (Peter and Marcus, for those of you who watch it) and both are now deeply regretting their actions.

It is a sad fact that, although human beings are made in God's image and are given the insight to know right from wrong, there are times when all of us go off on our own track instead of following God's way. So what happens when we realise we have messed up again?

That brings me to number three, a picture we have in the Vicarage. It is a stunning drawing called The Prodigal. It shows the moment when the Father in a story of Jesus goes to meet his wayward son who is coming home.

You may well remember the parable: a son demands his inheritance and heads off to enjoy himself. For a while he is fine, he spends his money like water on 'wild living' and in the process becomes

very popular. Then one day he finds the last penny has gone. Surprise, surprise, his 'friends' disappear with the money and he has to take the most degrading work to enable him just to survive. Eventually he comes to his senses and remembers that back at home even his Father's servants live better than him. He composes a speech of apology and sets off home. His Father sees him coming and runs to meet him, flings his arms round him and orders a party because this lost son has come home

Jesus used stories to tell fundamental truths, and this is one of the most important. There is only one human being ever, who was perfect, and that was Jesus himself. The rest of us need forgiveness; some us very obviously and others more subtly. But ALL of us fall short of what God wants us to be. The story of the lost son tells us that. regardless of how far short we have fallen of God's standards, God will still forgive us if we come back to Him in genuine sorrow. In fact, even more than that, God actively seeks us out so that He might offer us forgiveness. That is why Jesus died on the cross, paying the penalty for our wrongdoings, and rose again to new life so we might be sure of our forgiveness.

I forgave the dog, I don't know what will happen on Corrie, but God will certainly forgive anyone whose sorrow is genuine.

In recent years, with the demise of dairy farming in the area, we have seen a large increase in equine establishments and riding for pleasure. Please could we request that horse riders give the same consideration in return to other road users. We are often confronted by horses two abreast, which makes it well nigh impossible to pass safely on our narrow roads, horses on the wrong side of the road, riders using mobile phones. We have had occasions when riders have shouted abuse, telling us to slow down when we have already been driving at walking pace!

One would hope that horse riders are familiar with the Highway Code in relation to horses but would refer anyone to sections 49-55 which sets out the rules very clearly.

Rule 54 also states that you MUST NOT take a horse on a footpath. Unfortunately we have had several instances of horse riders ignoring this law, particularly on ROW 11 which links Lower Road and East End, i.e. the 2 spurs of Plough Lane in Marston, making this footpath unusable by pedestrians. We are taking

urgent steps to get signs put in place but in the meantime please ensure that you only use the many bridleways in the area. If you are unsure then check the local maps, they are all marked. Just to reinforce, it is against the law to ride on а footpath. Please don't think this is a "dig" at horse riders. I'm sure the culprits are in the minority. If you know any horse riders who are not from the villages but who come here to ride please pass this on. Thank you. Jill Hansford, Marston

What's happening on the Farm!

With the sun shining and the grass growing at last the cattle are out on their summer pastures!!! This puts to an end the daily task of cleaning out, bedding up and feeding, well until November anyway.

This month sees us preparing two fields ready to grow maize for the cattle to eat over the winter months. This job involves several processes before the actual maize seed can be planted. Firstly the fields are sprayed to kill any weeds that are growing. Maize is a crop which does not like any competition so the cleaner the seed bed the quicker the seed will germinate and grow. Secondly the fields are given a coating of manure to help the fertility of the soil. Thirdly father ploughs the fields to turn over the manure and the top six inches of the field leaving clean topsoil on the surface. Then the fourth job is to work the soil down to produce a clean and level seed bed. The machine used for this is a power harrow; it breaks the soil down and rolls it ready for the seed to be drilled. Finally we employ a contractor who has a specific drill to plant the maize seed; it plants eight rows at once so the job of planting does not take very long at all.

With the cattle out it gives us a chance to assess any repair jobs that need to be done around the yard. Because of the wet weather over the winter we are now able to plan the concreting of the rest of the yard and to erect the other new barns, that we have planning for. Trying to do these jobs in the rain would have been a nightmare.

Now that the cattle are out I must ask everyone when walking the footpaths where there are cattle to please take care and be alert. With both heifers that are calving and heavy in calf heifers out in the fields, dogs must be kept on leads at all times. Cattle are very protective over the offspring; we do not want any accidents to happen.

Hi Everybody

As I am sure some of you are aware my Fiancé, Kevin, was diagnosed with a rare type of cancer last year which is referred to as NETs, (Neuroendocrine Tumours). It is a very slow growing cancer, thankfully, which is relatively uncommon, only between 3-5 people per 100,000 are diagnosed in the UK each year with new cases of NETs.

He has chosen as a personal challenge to take part in the Lambretta Club of Great Britain's event to ride (and probably a bit of pushing involved as well) from one end of the country to the tip of Scotland (Land's End to John O'Groats) over four days in May on his classic Lambretta (Scooter), along with a friend for support and me as the Service Van driver to follow behind and pick them up in case of any eventuality, or supply spares and lots of tea!!

He has chosen to support The NET Patient Foundation as they are the only charity in the UK and Ireland that offer information and advice to those affected by neuroendocrine tumours, they work hard to raise awareness of these unusual cancers, and raise funds for vital research projects.

Marston Parish Council Report 25th March 2014

Present: Philip Salaman (Chairman), William Warden, Richard Howard, Cathy Kavanagh, Cille Packer and 14 parishioners.

The following items were discussed:

i. Investigation of the costs of repairs to the Phone Box. Our insurers have agreed we can make a claim.

ii. The Council decided to donate ± 1000 to the Village Hall funds on the successful award of a grant from Viridor for the major repair works.

iii. Dave Hansford reported that the remaining survey of footpaths will be available for the meeting in May. A group of 5 volunteers has been established to help with minor repair works. Wiltshire Council has agreed to provide signs and will be asked to offer help with replacing damaged stiles.

iv. When the ground is dry enough the Christmas tree on the Green will be removed.

v. William Warden will look into the repair of the seat at Norney Bridge.

vi. Marston is entering the Best Kept Village competition and the Council l would appreciate it if all parishioners could help keep the village tidy.

vii. It was agreed to call a public meeting in April to discuss the proposed plans for a solar park at Lower End Farm. The Council wishes to represent the views of all concerned before submitting a response to Wiltshire Council.

Flower Show 2014

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

For most of us, I suspect, one of the joys about living in a lovely village or a house in the country is the relative tranquillity. In addition, in this part of Wiltshire, I think most of us know at least some of our neighbours and enjoy the friendships that go with being part of a community. It seems to me that, in our rural communities, there is a remarkable number and variety of activities in which we can participate if we so wish.

Of course, for some of us, a local shop or post office or pharmacy may not be immediately nearby but many of our material needs can be ordered by phone or via the internet and deliveries can be made to our door. Alternatively, a short car ride can take us to Devizes or Westbury or Trowbridge or Melksham or even Salisbury where, in every case, shopping can be a delight (with apologies to towns I have not mentioned).

So what's not to like? Well, for a few, life in a rural area may not be so easy. For example, social housing is in short supply, so if you want your growing family to live nearby, and they can't afford to buy, then until now there was not much you could do about it. I'm pleased to say, however, that Wiltshire Council is proposing to give local connections a much higher priority in housing allocations, so it should soon be easier for local families to live in the area where they have grown up.

It's also challenging out here if you are looking for a job and you don't drive. It is hard to get to a place of employment by bus, and subsidised bus services are under threat in these challenging times. Concessionary bus pass holders may also fear for the survival of bus services and I have asked government to consider allowing a small charge if this would allow threatened services to continue.

Young people in their teens or twenties can also be isolated from the activities enjoyed by their peers in towns, especially in the evenings. Cycling on our local roads is not for the fainthearted and I have an ambition to improve safe rural cycling routes where possible.

For the sick or frail or elderly, a doctor's surgery visit let alone a trip to hospital can require planning and the assistance of a friend or neighbour. I applaud the wonderful services provided by Care & Link volunteers in this regard.

For individuals and families in need, therefore, rural life can be tough. Treasure the pleasures that our lovely area can offer, but remember those for whom the isolation can be difficult.

Worton & Marston Link Scheme held their AGM in the Rose & Crown this year with everyone welcome.

Volunteers in Wiltshire Link Schemes carried out almost a million miles in supportive journeys in 2013. Of that, Worton & Marston Link undertook 130 medical journeys, which included 42 to hospitals. The other trips involved visits to various local surgeries and dentists; there were 18 non-medical journeys. These 130 trips entailed 300 driver hours driving 2,916 miles, a slight increase from last year when 139 assignments involving 225 driver hours were carried out. The rise in hours was due to the increase in hospital trips.

We receive 5p for every mile we drive from Wiltshire Council in lieu of the infrequent bus service, however this may finish due to council budget cuts.
